If a topic has been addressed at a previous meeting, or the topic is too vague, the individual may be denied the opportunity to speak, unless strictly new information can be provided/clarified to the Board on that specific topic. Each participant shall be limited to 3 minutes, and no participant may speak more than once, unless the time is extended by the presiding officer or by a majority vote of the Board. All statements should be directed to the presiding officer; no person may address or question Board members individually, unless permitted to do so by a majority vote of the Board.
